

Marshall County Auditor Angie Johnson Birchmeier elevated to Treasurer of the Indiana Auditor’s Association for 2026

MARSHALL COUNTY — Angie Johnson Birchmeier, Auditor of Marshall County, has been elevated to serve as Treasurer of the Indiana Auditor’s Association following the retirement of the Association’s current Treasurer. Birchmeier had previously been elected to serve as the Association’s Secretary for 2026. Her new role places her on the Association’s Executive Committee, where she will help guide statewide collaboration, oversight, and professional development for all 92 counties.

A special meeting was held by the Auditors Association on November 25, 2025, to vote for the changes and the official transition of power occurred on December 2, 2025, during the Annual Commissioners Conference. Birchmeier currently represents the Northwest District on the Association’s Legislative Committee, contributing to policy discussions and

advocacy efforts that support Indiana counties. A lifelong resident of Marshall County, Birchmeier has built a strong record of public service. ranked team in the competition for the elimination bracket and handily beat the 8th ranked alliance in the round of 16 to advance to the quarterfinals. In quarterfinals they faced the 2nd ranked alliance and ultimately fell to them. However the team earned the distinction of getting 3rd place of 38 teams in the Robot Skills portion of the tournament in which teams compete in matches. Their score currently ranks them 19th in the state for high school teams and in the top 500 in the world. The team is proud of their accomplishments. “Coming in as freshmen and competing at the level we did was really challenging and eye opening at the same time. It shows that we have potential, and that other teams realize that we’re good picks for an alliance,” said Miles Stoneburner, the programmer for Mechannibalism. RoboPhish competed extremely well, especially against top high school teams also with a record of 3 and 3, They ranked 20th overall and picked a team from Anderson to complete the 16th seed alliance. They played great defense in their round of 16 match, but lost to the 6th seed alliance despite holding them to only 36 points, the lowest scoring match of the elimination rounds. The RoboPhish ranked

14th in skills matches, ranking them 16th in the state for middle school teams. Jackson Williams, one of the drivers and builders for RoboPhish said, “The tournament went well. Robotics is fun and it was a great bonding experience with my teammates.” Top Tier travels this weekend to Portage to compete in the Region Robotics Rumble.
